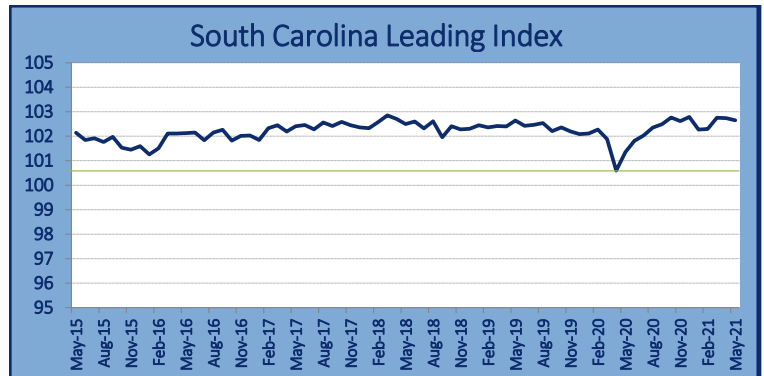




ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

The South Carolina Leading Index (SCLI) fell slightly last month, to a value (following revisions) of 102.65.

SCLI metrics were mixed in May. Unemployment claims were 44.5 percent lower than in May. The number of issued housing permits fell 9.7 percent month-over-month and valuation for the permits fell 16.0 percent. Average weekly manufacturing hours fell 2.2 percent. The Dow Jones Composite Average was up 1.5 percent.

The Conference Board's national Leading Economic Index increased in May to 114.5. This points to an accelerating economy, as index readings above 100 forecast economic expansion.

Non-Seasonally Adjusted Wage and Salary Employment

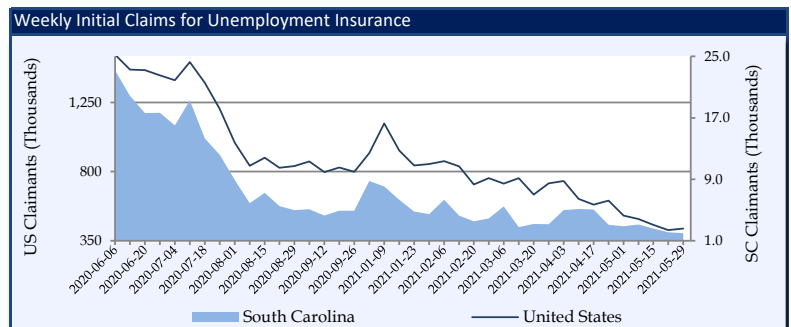
South Carolina's total non-seasonally adjusted nonfarm employment rose by 10,400 net jobs to 2,126,000 in May, a 0.5 percent increase from revised April numbers and 6.2 percent higher than one year ago. Many sectors reported net job gains for the month, including Leisure and Hospitality (9,200); Trade, Transportation and Utilities (4,500); Manufacturing (1,400); Other Services (1,100); Educational and Health Services (800); and Information (600). Net job losses were reported in the Government (-4,800); Professional and Business Services (-1,000); Finance (-800); and Construction (-600) sectors. Natural Resources and Mining was unchanged month-over-month. Compared to one year ago, the state economy added 123,300 net nonfarm jobs.

Weekly Unemployment Claims

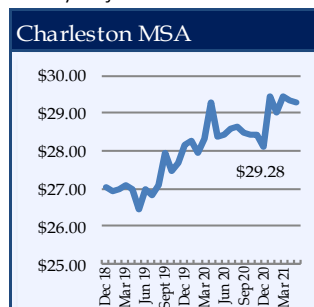
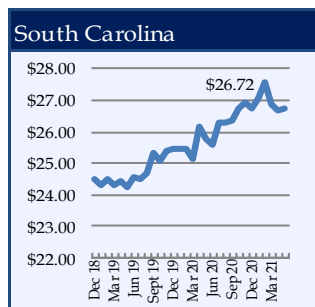
The average number of initial reported claims for unemployment insurance in the state decreased in May. The average for the month was 2,536 weekly initial claims, a 44.5 percent drop month-over-month.

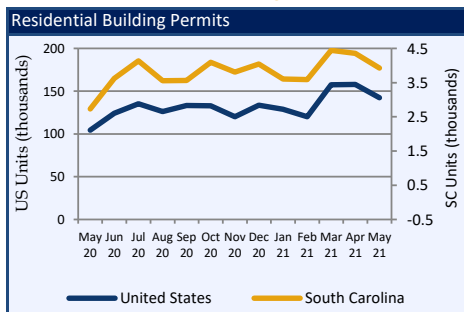
Real Estate & Business Activity

In May, the number of building permits issued in South Carolina for new residential construction fell 9.7 percent to 3,928. This figure was up 43.8 percent from one year ago. Valuation for the permits fell 16.0 percent month-over-month, but was 51.0 percent higher than one year ago. Total closings were down 2.0 percent compared to April, while the median sales price was up 1.9 percent. Total closings among the top six MSAs fell in all but Columbia, with Spartanburg reporting the steepest drop (10.0 percent). Median sales price rose in five of the MSAs, with Spartanburg reporting the only decline (-0.5 percent).

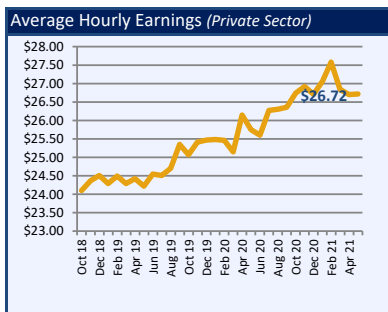

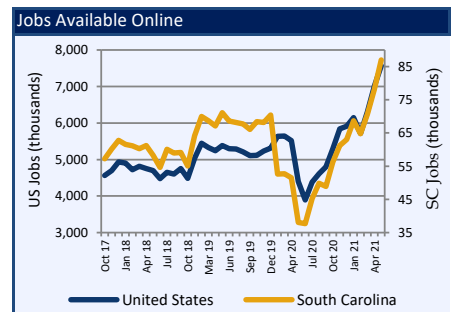

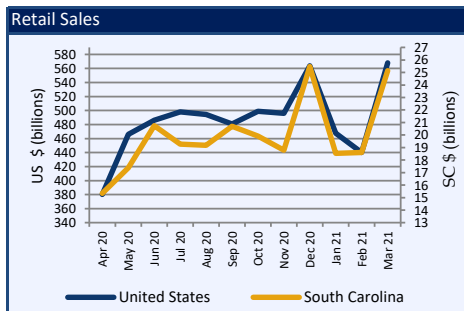

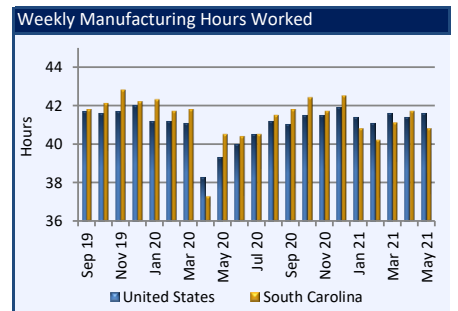

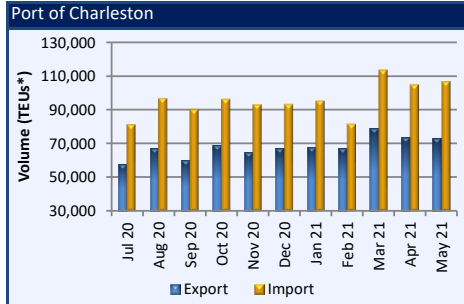

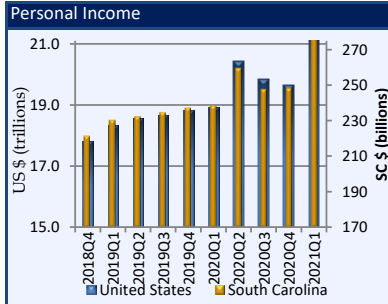

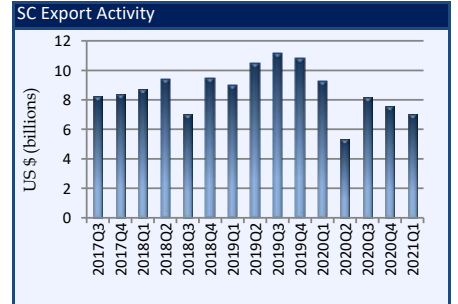
Income and Output
