SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE <u>GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT</u>

This Grant Agreement dated 11/9/23 is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and the City of Spartanburg (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) <u>Grant</u> means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to develop downtown Section 2: economic growth infrastructure. Recent State budgets have included a total of \$54 in state funding for economic development infrastructure in downtown Spartanburg. This multiblock project will involve \$120 million in public investment (\$54 million in state funds plus \$66 in local public funding) along with \$305 million in private development. This project will transform several blocks in the heart of downtown Spartanburg to include new tourist destinations, entertainment venues, and public gathering spaces; over 200,000 square feet of new office spaces, 375 residential units, 150 hotel rooms, public parking for 1,500 vehicles; and full redesign and reconstruction of water, sewer, stormwater, electrical, and telecommunications infrastructure for a multi-block area in downtown. Collectively, these investments will significantly boost Spartanburg tourist economy and solidify downtown Spartanburg as a white-collar employment hub. \$42 million will be provided by the department of commerce and will provide for the above costs. \$12 million of this request was appropriated in the FY 22-23 Appropriations Act, Proviso 118.19(94)(a), and \$20 million and \$10 million were appropriated in the FY 23-24 Act, Proviso 118.19(87)(k) and (l), respectively.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$42,000,000 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be disbursed to Grantee upon execution of the grant agreement.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive

prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within 18 months of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

Section 11: SANCTIONS: If the Grantee fails or refuses at any time to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the SCDOC may take, in addition to any relief that it is entitled to at law, any or all of the following actions: require repayment of all or a portion of any Grant funds provided; cancel, terminate, or suspend, in whole or in part, the Grant and this Agreement; or refrain from extending any further assistance or Grant funds to the Grantee until such time as the Grantee is in full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 12: APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement is made under and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Carolina, without regard to conflicts of laws principles. The federal and state courts within the State of South Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement.

Section 13: TERMS AND CONDITIONS: Contingent on written approval of both parties, the SCDOC reserves the right to add or delete terms and conditions of this Agreement as may be required by revisions and additions to changes in the requirements, regulations, and laws governing the SCDOC and any other agency of the State.

SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE <u>GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT</u>

This Grant Agreement dated October 10, 2023 is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and the City of Forest Acres (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) <u>Grant</u> means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to purchase property and construct a park as part of the overall redevelopment of the former Richland Mall site.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be forwarded to the Grantee once the grant award agreement is executed and accepted.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within 48 months of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

Section 11: SANCTIONS: If the Grantee fails or refuses at any time to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the SCDOC may take, in addition to any relief that it is entitled to at law, any or all of the following actions: require repayment of all or a portion of any Grant funds provided; cancel, terminate, or suspend, in whole or in part, the Grant and this Agreement; or refrain from extending any further assistance or Grant funds to the Grantee until such time as the Grantee is in full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 12: APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement is made under and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Carolina, without regard to conflicts of laws principles. The federal and state courts within the State of South Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement.

Section 13: TERMS AND CONDITIONS: Contingent on written approval of both parties, the SCDOC reserves the right to add or delete terms and conditions of this

Agreement as may be required by revisions and additions to changes in the requirements, regulations, and laws governing the SCDOC and any other agency of the State.

This Grant Agreement dated September 30, 2023 is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and the Graduation Alliance (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) <u>Grant</u> means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to to provide the Adult Workforce High School Diploma Program in conjunction the SC Coordinating Council for Economic Development, the Department of Commerce. Graduation Alliance launched the Adult Workforce High School Diploma to provide adults with an avenue to high school graduation. This program fosters college and career exploration as well as connect job creators to skilled and ready workers.

Modeled after similar state programs in Ohio, Michigan, and Indiana, South Carolina's Adult Workforce High School Diploma is a pay-for-performance model where payment is only issued to the providers when students achieve milestones. These milestones come in the form of credits earned, industry recognized credentials, and graduation.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be forwarded to the Grantee once construction is about to commence.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify

the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024 of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT

This Grant Agreement dated November 6, 2023 is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and the City of Loris (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement means this Grant Award Agreement</u>.
- (b) <u>Grant</u> means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project means the project identified and described in Section 2.</u>
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to Purchase the Old Loris High School Property at 3610 Broad Street, Loris, South Carolina 29569.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be forwarded to the Grantee once the property has a closing date agreed upon by interested parties.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns

that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within 12 months of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

Section 11: SANCTIONS: If the Grantee fails or refuses at any time to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the SCDOC may take, in addition to any relief that it is entitled to at law, any or all of the following actions: require repayment of all or a portion of any Grant funds provided; cancel, terminate, or suspend, in whole or in part, the Grant and this Agreement; or refrain from extending any further assistance or Grant funds to the Grantee until such time as the Grantee is in full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 12: APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement is made under and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Carolina, without regard to conflicts of laws principles. The federal and state courts within the State of South Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement.

Section 13: TERMS AND CONDITIONS: Contingent on written approval of both parties, the SCDOC reserves the right to add or delete terms and conditions of this

Agreement as may be required by revisions and additions to changes in the requirements, regulations, and laws governing the SCDOC and any other agency of the State.

Section 14: REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

Program/Financial Reporting Requirements:

The Grantee agrees to submit quarterly progress reports that provide a status update and identification of any material issues affecting the Project. The progress reports will be submitted to the SCDOC by email. Progress reports will be due as indicated below. The progress report shall include a narrative of the progress with the project, summary of expenditures activities and progress towards meeting goals and objectives outlined in Attachment A. The Grantee further agrees to complete and submit all quarterly progress reports and any other reports, in such form and according to such schedule, to the extent not specified herein, as may be required by the SCDOC.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000.00 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns

that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. 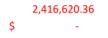

SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE <u>GRANT AWARD</u> AGREEMENT

This Grant Agreement dated December 21, 2023 is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and the City of Seneca (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) <u>Grant</u> means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: **PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Funds will be used to revitalize downtown Seneca.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$12 million to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be forwarded to the Grantee once design, demolition, and/or construction are about to commence.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within 24 months of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

Section 11: SANCTIONS: If the Grantee fails or refuses at any time to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the SCDOC may take, in addition to any relief that it is entitled to at law, any or all of the following actions: require repayment of all or a portion of any Grant funds provided; cancel, terminate, or suspend, in whole or in part, the Grant and this Agreement; or refrain from extending any further assistance or Grant funds to the Grantee until such time as the Grantee is in full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

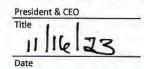

SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE <u>GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT</u>

This Grant Agreement dated November 16, 2023, is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and the Southern Carolina Regional Development Alliance (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) <u>Grant</u> means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to upgrade the rail crossing along with road and associated utility improvements at the Southern Carolina Industrial Campus.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$750,000 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. All funds will be forward to the Grantee once design is initiated of the project.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Over the last year, the City of Spartanburg has been working on a project to develop airport property for public hangar development: We have added a new sewer and fire hydrant line to the Airport property from an adjacent road. This new infrastructure has enabled this property to be developed into six large aircraft hangar locations.

This grant funds request will allow the airport to construct and rehabilitate a taxi-way to allow larger and heavier aircraft into this newly developed area.

This developed area will allow aircraft companies to move in and occupy this area and create local jobs as part of our economic development initiative.

The City of Spartanburg will also construct a new hangar economic development and aircraft storage.

In addition, funds will be allocated towards repairing our public community hangar to allow the local aircraft owners to store their aircraft, as we have a 5-7-year waiting list for public hangar space.

SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE <u>GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT</u>

This Grant Agreement dated 10/6/2023 is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and Umoja Village (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) $\frac{\text{Grant}}{\text{Project.}}$ means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to create positive outcomes in the lives of citizens to enrich Aiken and surrounding communities through the reduction of violent crime in our towns; provide an increased emphasis and support toward clients' educational goals and youth development; leadership development skills; connect and provide resources to those interested in starting or maintaining small businesses; connect the unemployed or underemployed with employment opportunities along with establishing employment and training programs as adult second chance opportunities; support of the Umoja Village Resource Center and its overall mission; and support and establish our clients' life action plans to become more independent and less reliant on governmental assistance as a lifestyle.

Section 3: AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$250,000.00 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be forwarded to the Grantee once the grant agreement is fully executed.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part

of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within 12-24 months of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

Section 11: SANCTIONS: If the Grantee fails or refuses at any time to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the SCDOC may take, in addition to any relief that it is entitled to at law, any or all of the following actions: require repayment of all or a portion of any Grant funds provided; cancel, terminate, or suspend, in whole or in part, the Grant and this Agreement; or refrain from extending any further assistance or Grant funds to the Grantee until such time as the Grantee is in full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 12: APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement is made under and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Carolina, without regard to

conflicts of laws principles. The federal and state courts within the State of South Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement.

Section 13: TERMS AND CONDITIONS: Contingent on written approval of both parties, the SCDOC reserves the right to add or delete terms and conditions of this Agreement as may be required by revisions and additions to changes in the requirements, regulations, and laws governing the SCDOC and any other agency of the State.

Section 14: REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

Program/Financial Reporting Requirements:

The Grantee agrees to submit quarterly progress reports that provide a status update and identification of any material issues affecting the Project. The progress reports will be submitted to the SCDOC by email. Progress reports will be due as indicated below. Progress report shall include a narrative of the progress with the project, summary of expenditures activities and progress towards meeting goals and objectives outlined in Attachment A. The Grantee further agrees to complete and submit all quarterly progress reports and any other reports, in such form and according to such schedule, to the extent not specified herein, as may be required by the SCDOC.

SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE <u>GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT</u>

This Grant Agreement dated November 1, 2023, is between the South Carolina Department of Commerce (SCDOC) and Clemson University (the Grantee). The acceptance of the Agreement creates a contract between the SCDOC and the Grantee, legally binding the Grantee to carry out the activities and obligations set forth in this Agreement, all in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in any appendices attached hereto and any other documents or conditions referred to herein.

Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

- (a) <u>Agreement</u> means this Grant Award Agreement.
- (b) <u>Grant means the dollars committed by the SCDOC to the Grantee for the Project.</u>
- (c) <u>Grantee</u> means the entity designated for the Grant and set forth above.
- (d) <u>Project</u> means the project identified and described in Section 2.
- (e) <u>State</u> means the State of South Carolina and any agencies or offices thereof.

Section 2: PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Funds will be used to address:

• identification and characterization of discrete segments within the offshore wind supply chain, including major manufacturing operations, specialty component manufacturing, component assembly, and ancillary services for future offshore wind energy projects along the east coast of the United States;

estimated number and type of direct manufacturing jobs;

potential ancillary economic benefits;

• potential industry investment in South Carolina and opportunities for rural economic development;

• highest impact investment opportunities to produce the largest net economic benefit;

- potential benefits to local tax bases;
- expected additional contribution to state economic output;

• any additional information the department identifies as relevant to the conduct of its study; and

• actionable next steps the State should take to recruit new, and assist the expansion of existing, offshore wind supply chain companies, in order to capitalize on the 109 billion dollar offshore wind industry.

Section 3:AWARD AMOUNT: The SCDOC hereby commits an amount not to exceed \$250,000 to be used only for the Project and related costs. Eligible costs that can be paid from the Grant shall include only those costs necessary for the completion of the Project. Funds will be forwarded to the Grantee once SCDOC has received the appropriations relating to the project and performance is about to commence.

SCDOC agrees to reimburse Grantee for all costs incurred up to the agreed upon amount of \$250,000. SCDOC agrees to transfer the full amount of the agreement to Grantee upon

execution of this Agreement, per Proviso 118.19(C) of the 2023-2024 Appropriation Act, Part 1B, Section 118 – X910 – Statewide Revenue.

Section 4: AMENDMENTS: Any changes in the scope of work of the Project, including change orders or cost increases, must be submitted in writing by the Grantee to the SCDOC as a request for an award adjustment, and such request must clearly identify the need for the change or relief. Any adjustment granted by the SCDOC must receive prior approval from SCDOC then adjustments shall be appended to this Agreement as an amendment.

Section 5: PERFORMANCE: By acceptance of this Grant, the Grantee agrees that it will complete or cause to be completed the Project, including any approved amendments appended hereto. Should Grantee fail to cause the completion of all or part of the Project, the SCDOC shall be entitled to reimbursement from the Grantee of any Grant funds that were received by the Grantee for any work that was not performed, less any non-cancelable obligations, including obligations for student stipends, graduate assistantships, and postdoctoral fellowships which shall end no sooner than the end of University's academic year during which termination occurs.

Section 6: FUNDING OVERRUNS/UNDERRUNS: Except for relief granted under Section 4, the Grantee agrees that it will return surplus Grant funds that result from project cost underruns, and, contingent on the Grantee deciding to proceed with the project, that it will commit and provide monies from its own resources for cost overruns that are required to complete the Project. This Agreement creates no obligation on the part of the SCDOC or the State to provide funds for the cost overruns.

Section 7: AUDIT: The Grantee must include an examination and accounting of the expenditures of Grant funds in its first annual audit following the completion of the Project, and submit a copy of the audit report to the SCDOC. The Grantee agrees that it will reimburse the SCDOC for unauthorized and unwarranted expenditures disclosed in the audit, if so directed by the SCDOC. The SCDOC may monitor the Grantee at least twice during the grant period and the Grantee shall make available for audit and inspection by the SCDOC staff, its representatives, or State Auditor's Office all the books, records, files and other documents relating to any matters pertaining to the Project or this Agreement.

Section 8: DISCRIMINATION: The Grantee shall not, and shall impose on its Contractors the obligation not to, discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Grantee and any Contractor shall be required to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, or handicap.

Section 9: MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Grantee shall retain records for Grant funds for a period of three years after its final close out. The Grantee shall maintain records relating to procurement matters for the period of time prescribed by applicable procurement laws, regulations and guidelines, but no less than three years. All other pertinent Grant and Project records including financial records, supporting documents, and statistical records shall be retained for a minimum of three years after notification in writing by the SCDOC of the closure of the Grant. However, if any litigation, claim, or audit is initiated before the expiration of any such period, then records must be retained for three years after the litigation, claim, or audit is resolved.

Section 10: PROJECT COMPLETION: The Grantee must complete the Project within 12 months of the Date of Award of this Grant. Completion is defined as the final documentation by Grantee to the SCDOC of Grant funds expended and issuance by the SCDOC of a notification in writing of the closure of the Grant. The SCDOC may grant extensions to this completion period requirement at its discretion.

Section 11: SANCTIONS: If either party fails or refuses at any time to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the either party may take, in addition to any relief that it is entitled to at law, any or all of the following actions: require repayment of all or a portion of any Grant funds provided, less any funds used for successful completion of any portion of the project, including any non-cancelable obligations, as previously referenced in Section 5; cancel, terminate, or suspend, in whole or in part, the Grant and this Agreement; or SCDOC may refrain, in respect to the Grantee, from extending any further assistance or Grant funds to the Grantee until such time as the Grantee is in full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 12: APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement is made under and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Carolina, without regard to conflicts of laws principles. The federal and state courts within the State of South Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement.

Section 13: TERMS AND CONDITIONS: Contingent on written approval of both parties, the SCDOC reserves the right to add or delete terms and conditions of this Agreement as may be required by revisions and additions to changes in the requirements, regulations, and laws governing the SCDOC and any other agency of the State.

Section 14: REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

Program/Financial Reporting Requirements:

The Grantee agrees to submit quarterly progress reports that provide a status update and identification of any material issues affecting the Project. The progress reports will be submitted to the SCDOC by email. Progress reports will be due as indicated below. Progress report shall include a narrative of the progress with the project, summary of expenditures activities and progress towards meeting goals and objectives outlined in Attachment A. The Grantee further agrees to complete and submit all quarterly progress reports and any other reports, in such form and according to such schedule, to the extent not specified herein, as may be required by the SCDOC.
